







DODGE BADGER

You will need a board and two sets of counters - four each.



1. Place your counters into the four starting positions on the board.
2. Take turns to move a counter **ONE** space, either vertically or horizontally into an **EMPTY** space.
3. You may **NOT** place a counter in a square that already contains one.
4. You can't jump over counters.
5. If you can't move, you miss a turn.
6. You win if you can get all of your counters into your opponent's starting positions.

Foxes will, sometimes live in badger setts. The badgers seem to tolerate them, but there's only one boss!

Foxes will also live in abandoned badger setts. You can usually tell when a fox is in residence. There will be a strong smell, (a sort of ammonia smell, though different people describe it in other ways). There may be old food, such as dead birds, wings, feathers, small mammals, etc., around the sett, (which, I suppose should now be called an 'earth' if foxes are living in it.) Badgers NEVER bring food home.
